We also want to thank Tina Burkhart who for many years kept our books in order and served as our bookkeeper. We appreciate all that she did to get the financial records organized and in order. We also welcome Jeanette Lahm from Laurelville as our President-Elect and Carey Miller as our new bookkeeper.

We believe that the work you do is important and we want to support you in the ways that we can. We hope that you will choose to join us again and we can journey through this year together.
