
TREAT YOURSELF:

LODGING

Emory & Fraser Lodges

Most of these hotel style room accommodations are furnished with a queen size bed and one bunk bed sleeping up to 4 people, all with private washrooms. Three rooms are fully wheelchair accessible while three other rooms contain kitchenettes. A couple of rooms sleep up to 6 people and a couple have one queen bed sleeping up to 2 people. Each lodge has comfortable lounges and meeting spaces that are perfect places to meet, visit and relax.



Squeah Lodge

There are 7 rooms in one hallway in the second floor of the main Squeah lodge. Most rooms have 4 bunk beds sleeping 8 people. Many rooms contain beds with one slideout bottom bunk to provide a double bed. Washrooms for the lodge sleeping area are multiple shared toilet and sink units. Main gathering sessions will take place in Squeah Lodge.



Travel Subsidy information:

We want as many member individuals and camps as possible to have the opportunity to participate in MCA events. We believe this experience is a valuable time of building relationships within the Mennonite camping community and have designated a travel subsidy for those who must travel a greater distance to attend MCA gatherings.

Amount available:

USA: Twenty-eight \$250 individual travel subsidies, totaling \$7,000, are available. Canada: Six \$250 individual travel subsidies, totaling \$1,500, are available.

Who is eligible:

Any staff or board member of a member MCA camp.

Any non-member individual or family member is welcome (and encouraged!) to register and attend, but are not eligible for a travel subsidy.

Details:

- Beginning October 1, thru January 1st, individuals may apply for one \$250 travel subsidy.
- Up to 3 staff or board members per camp will be granted the subsidy.
- After January 1, any remaining subsidies will be available for any additional staff or board members to apply, from any member camp, including those who have already received 3 subsidies.
- Subsidy checks will be handed out at the Camp Squeah gathering, or email transferred (Canada) on March 11.

Vancouver (YVR) is a large international airport located 181 km/112 mi west of Camp Squeah (approx. 2 hr drive). **Abbotsford** (YXX) is a smaller international airport located 105 km/65 mi west of Camp Squeah (approx. 1 hr 10 min drive). If possible, please consider flying info Abbotsford as consideration for shuttle logistics to and from Camp Squeah. Thank you!
